

Overview of MLP PIP Webinar Series

The National Center for Medical-Legal Partnership (NCMLP), in collaboration with the Texas A&M University Institute for Healthcare Access (HAI) and supported by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), offered a webinar series for health center-based MLP planning, implementation, and practice (PIP Webinar Series). Throughout the series, the Health Center MLP Toolkit was used as a key resource. Each webinar featured insights and examples from experienced health centers and/or PCAs, addressing the following T/TA needs:

- 1. Understanding core components of medical-legal partnerships;
- 2. Identifying and engaging legal partners;
- 3. Using medical-legal partnerships to influence policy changes benefiting patients and communities;
- 4. Sharing best practices for developing workflows for referrals, information sharing, and integration in medical-legal partnerships;
- 5. Implementing legal needs screening aligned with social determinants of health screens.

What is a health center?

HEALTH CENTERS:

- Are community-based and serve more than 30 million people, about 90% of whom have incomes less than 200% of the federal poverty level.
- Provide access to medical, dental, behavioral, and other health care services.
- Provide care for all, with special initiatives for people experiencing homelessness, agricultural workers, and residents of public housing.
- A public or nonprofit entity can become a HRSA-supported health center by applying for Health Center Program funding or receiving designation as a Health Center Program look-alike. HRSA's Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC) oversees the
